2018 KEURING/INSPECTION INFORMATION, RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Directed by the Friesian Horse Association of North America (FHANA) and KFPS.

Hosted by the Alberta Friesian Horse Association (AFHA). By signing the FHANA inspection entry form you agreed to all the terms and conditions of the Inspections, which can be found in the [Inspection Handbook](#) and on [FHANA's website – Inspection info](#).

- **Inspection date: Monday October 3, 2018 – Start at 8:00 am.**
- **Inspection site: Bosch Farms, Burnt Lake Trail, Red Deer.**
- **Judges:** Wil Thijssen and Danielle van Vliet
- **Runners:** Richard Meinen and Raymond Kortstra – Fee: \$ 100.00 per horse.
- **KFPS** does not allow horses from foreign associations to be inspected and re-inspected in the same year.
- **FHANA** requires **ALL** horses over the age of 6 months to have a **current Coggins** test. A copy of which will be required to be turned in to the inspection site hosts **PRIOR** to the event.
- **AFHA's** requirement for all horses over the age of 6 months is a proof of vaccinations (copy of receipt or vaccination labels)
- **Drug Policy:**
FHANA will follow the direction and guidelines of the United States Equestrian Federation. FHANA will test for all illegal substances that the USEF tests for in regard to *The Therapeutic Substance Provisions GR410*. A list of these drugs and supplements can be found at www.USEF.org. Sites will be randomly chosen to be tested. The number of sites may vary from year to year.
- **Attention participants!! Please read:**

- **Owners, grooms, helpers**, i.e. anyone handling a horse during the day must proof to be a member of a Provincial Equestrian Sports Office (for Alberta: AEF).
- **Stabling:** Box stalls are available; Day: \$ 30.00 + 1 night = \$ 60.00.
- **Bedding:** Not included in stall rental. Bring your own or buy it via AFHA.
- **Facility Rent:** Mandatory share of the facility rent.
- **Use of the arena prior to the inspection day:** \$ 30.00 per hour or part of an hour.
- **Bathing of your horse(s):** \$ 15.00 per use.
- **Fees:** Payment of the fees before September 30, 2018 and can be done by e-transfer or cheque. As usual the facility fees will be determined and shared, depending on the number of horses being presented.
- **Participant's package** will be given to you when you arrive or on the morning of the keuring/inspection (after we've received your payment).
- Be sure to bring your **horse's papers:** the original laminated papers for older horses that already have them and the foal's blue papers.

- Your foal must be **micro chipped** by your vet prior to the keuring. There will be no onsite micro chipping.
- Chasing/encouraging with whip and/or rattle box:
This is your responsibility and you must take care of that yourself or ask someone to do the chasing of your horse(s) at the time of its inspection. It is in your advantage that the runners don't do that, so they can focus on showing your horse(s) on its best.
- **Don't forget:** Feed and hay, water buckets, bedding, presentation halters, bits & bridles and leads, grooming supplies, show sheen, clippers, and hoof black.
(DON'T MAKE YOUR HORSE'S HOOFS BLACK INSIDE THE FACILITY!! PLEASE APPLY THE HOOF BLACK ONLY OUTSIDE OR AT THE APPOINTED PLACE!!)
- All horses must arrive at least an hour prior the start time.
- Organizer reserves the right to refuse any entry or participation to any individual who has been expelled from, refused membership in, or is otherwise not in good standing with any local or provincial equestrian organization.
- We ask that all who are participating with horses please fill out and sign the Liability forms.

Additional information:

- Adult horses of category 5 & 6 (3 yr. old and 4+ yr. old mares for studbook/star) will be initially presented in a group. The reason for this procedure is that horses in a group are more relaxed and therefore the walk can be judged better. Owners need to have their horses at ringside when the class starts and ready to go in with someone prepared to lead the horse at a walk. This procedure will also happen at the end of most classes. There will not be enough runners to lead all these horses, so owners need to be prepared to do this and properly attired and shod to walk briskly in the dirt with the horse. Horses are being judged at this time!! While not required, it is customary to wear white pants and a white shirt. Please do not wear anything odd such as a dress or a tuxedo as this will be distracting. The desired effect should be functional and neat.
- Ribbon and award information:
A yellow participation ribbon is to be handed out to horses in categories 1-7 and 12, 13, and 17 that do not receive a premie.
Horses in categories 8-10 and 14: Horses that are entered in this category cannot lose their current premie and will receive one of the blue ribbons if their predicate/premie does not change.
- Champion and Reserve Champion Ribbons awarded:
 1. Champion and Reserve Champion Youth (Categories 1, 2, 3 & 4)
 2. Champion and Reserve Champion Mare (Categories 5 through 11)
 3. Champion and Reserve Champion Gelding (Categories 12, 13 & 14)
 Only horses that receive a 2nd premie or higher will be eligible for the various awards.
Stallions are not to be considered for Champion rounds.
*Champion of the Day: eligible from categories 3 through 14. (No foals and no stallions)
- IBOP Cup (Iron Spring Farm Riding & Dream Gait Friesian Driving). The overall winner with the highest score will win an ISF or DGF Cooler along with a check for \$500. 2nd place will receive the coolers along with the check for \$250. The remaining top 5 will receive a cooler. All ties are broken by the FHANA office staff and the individual scores will be used as a tie breaker starting with the trot. Horses must have a qualifying score of 77 or higher be considered for the champion or Reserve Champion.
- The Vanderploeg North American Breeder Award. This award is awarded to the best 3 or 4-year-old mare judged in each year's North American judging cycle. Primary criteria is the mare must be

born in North America in order to be eligible. This award will be awarded to the breeders of record on the registration papers. The winner will receive a cash prize of \$500 payable to the breeder of record with the reserve winner receiving a cash prize of \$250. The breeder of the winning mare will also receive a special individual award and will be listed on the perpetual award located in the FHANA office.

Just as a reminder if your horse does make either ster, crown, or model. You will be invoiced for a fee before your new papers will be issued. Upon completion of the inspections, it normally takes 4-6 weeks before your new papers will be sent from the FHANA office.

- **Order of go:**
IBOP tests,
Gelding,
Foals; colts and fillies,
3-year old mares for studbook/star,
4+year old mares for studbook/star,
4-6-year old star mares for premium/crown,
7+ year old star mares for premium/crown/model.
- **Hotels:** Due to the little use in the past it was not reasonable to secure a block of rooms or a group rate. Previous years we secured rooms with Towne Place Suites-Marriott 6822 66th Street in Red Deer (www.towneplacesuitesreddeer.com).
What I have heard this hotel is good, but there is a lot of choice in Red Deer and you will be able to find one if needed.
- **Camping:** Possible at Bosch Farms. No hook-ups. Please phone the site host ahead (403-598-3675).
- **No dogs allowed on the premises, including the parking lot!**
- **BBQ** for participants and AFHA members. Non-members: \$ 20.00 p/p. R.S.V.P. by Saturday September 29, 2018.
